Managing risk

When you are either running or setting up a glamping site it is likely that you will be thinking welcome hampers, booking systems and setting your rental rates. You might be wondering whether to add a log burner for those winter bookings, or maybe you are weighing up the pros and cons of accepting dogs, installing a hot tub or what sort of seating you need for around the fire pit. These are all exciting and important things to be thinking about!

However, arguably more important, but less exciting, (and certainly often overlooked in the initial stages of setting up your glamping site) are the various rules and regulations that we need to adhere to as glamping site owners. Whilst some laws might be obvious, others are less so. Either way, we can't escape the amount of legislation that we need to abide by to keep our guests safe.

The Glamping Association's aim is to take the confusion out of risk management, by guiding you down a structured pathway helping you make your glamping site a great place for your guest to visit in the knowledge you are taking their safety seriously.

The information in various forms contained on our website is aimed to provide some guidance and useful resources for glamping site owners who are researching legislation that relates to running and owning a glamping site. However, it is not an exhaustive list, and rules and regulations are frequently updated. In addition, we are in no way lawyers or accountants so please treat this information as a starting point to conduct your own research rather than professional advice.
